Declaration into the degree program requires:

- Documentation of one year of service as an instructional aide (otherwise known as paraprofessional, educational aide, or teacher's assistant) with classroom-based duties and current employment as an instructional aide with classroom-based duties in a PK-12 public or accredited private school.
- Completion of 36 credit hours of pre-major coursework, with an overall 2.5 GPA.
- ENG 1310 and ENG1320 or 6 credits with General Education Core attribute 010 (ENGL 1301 & ENGL 1302 @ Collin College)
- MATH 1312, 1315, or 1319 or 3 credits with General Education Core attribute 020
- MATH 2311 (MATH 1350 @ TXST)
- 6 credits with General Education Core attribute 030
- 3 credits in PHIL 1305 or 1320 or with General Education Core attribute 040
- 6 credits in HIST 1310 or 1320 or POSI 2310 or 2320 or with General Education Core Attribute 060 or 070
- 3 credits in COMM 1310 or 2338 or 2315 (SPCH 1311 or SPCH 1315 @ Collin College)
- 6 additional credits from the remaining 15 hours of General Education Core Requirements

Students admitted to the university prior to completing these requirements will be classified as a "pre-major" in education.

Once declared into the program, degree progress will require continued employment as an instructional aide in a Texas PK-12 public or accredited private school and admittance to the Educator Preparation Program.

Minimum Graduation Requirements:

- 2.0 or higher TXST GPA
- 2.75 Overall GPA
- 2.25 or higher major GPA
- 2.0 or higher minor GPA
- Minimum 121 overall hours

- 9 hours of writing intensive coursework
- Minimum of 36 hours of advanced coursework (3000-4000 level)
- 24 hours of advanced TXST coursework (3000-4000 level)
- 24 of the last 30 hours must be completed with TXST coursework

Teacher Certification

In addition to an earned baccalaureate degree, there are six criteria for earning certification:

- Admittance to the Educator Preparation Program
- A passing criminal history review
- Completion of Field-Based Blocks
- Passing scores on all required certification exams
- Satisfactory completion of Clinical Experience
- Applications for graduation as well as state certification
- Admittance to the Educator Preparation Program
- In order to pursue teacher certification, students must apply and be invited to attend the Educator Preparation Program through the Office of Educator Preparation. If a student accepts this invitation, the student must then pay a required \$35 Texas Education Agency technology fee before the student will be officially admitted.
