Dear Applicant,

We are elated that you are considering a career in dental hygiene. We partnered with the institution for which you are applying to create the opportunity for dual enrollment. This program is the first of its kind in the nation. Dual enrollment means that you will be taking courses from both institutions in a melded curriculum. Our goal is to allow you the opportunity to complete your Bachelor of Science in Dental Hygiene degree, while simultaneously completing the Associate of Science in Dental Hygiene degree at the partnering institution. For you, this could begin, as early as fall semester of your first year of hygiene school.

To be considered for dual enrollment, you will need to be accepted by the partnering institution's dental hygiene program. In addition, you will need to be core complete before beginning the first fall semester of the dental hygiene program. The core is typically completed at the partnering institution, but obviously could be completed elsewhere.

These courses that we have partnered to bring you, are taught via distance education. The courses are blended together with the dental hygiene courses offered at the AAS site. With that being said, the program is a full time commitment, about the same as a full time job. Please see the corresponding AAS institution's website for the dual enrollment curriculum. We recommend that you consider not working, if at all possible, and committing all efforts to your dental hygiene education. In this program, there is much emphasis placed on high level thinking skills through applying, analyzing, synthesizing and evaluating content, which will require more of your effort and time than just learning for knowledge and comprehension.

Please visit our TWU website, which provides great information on taking online/distance courses and provides students information on what it takes to be successful in an online course. This website also provides an online assessment, *SmarterMeasure*, to help you determine if you can be successful in the online learning environment.
