Trustee Adrian Rodriguez was absent. Other attendees included District President Cary A. Israel, college administrators, faculty, students, staff, community members, and vendor representatives.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

No public comment was presented.

PRESENTATIONS

Credit Card Services

Ralph Hall, Vice President of Administrative Services and Chief Financial Officer, presented information to the board regarding credit card services in follow up to last month's approval of the renewal of First Data Merchant Services to provide credit card services to the District. Mr. Hall said six vendors viewed the bid package for the original contract when it was published in June 2011 and four of those vendors responded. First Data Merchant Services was determined to the best evaluated offer. Based on their services and the bids received from other vendors, a renewal with First Data Merchant Services was recommended in June 2013 and approved by the board. Mr. Hall displayed the bids received from Branch Banking & Trust, Chase Paymentech, and Bank of America Merchant Services. He also showed the Board of Trustees the itemized listing by month from 2011 through year-to-date 2013 of the total sales, number of transactions, total refunds, and credit card services fees. In FY2011, credit card services cost the District 1.41% of total sales, service costs were 1.21% of sales in FY2012 and 1.24% year-to-date for FY2013. Mr. Hall said that according to First Data, the average effective rates for those who process at the District's volume level (\$25 to \$50 million annually) range from 1.81% to 2.05%. Collin College's rates fall well below these averages.

Carelyn Mitchell was acknowledged for the tremendous job she has done in degree planning and graduation during the last 25 years. President Israel said she has been a competent, diligent, professional, and quality worker who did her work quietly, but was always a top-notch colleague. Her contributions to Collin have been appreciated and her expertise will be missed.

2013-7-2 Approval of the Permanent Expulsion of a Student

<u>2013-7-3 Ratification of the Action Taken in Negotiating and Finalizing the Contract</u> <u>with American Food & Vending, Inc. to Provide Food Services, Catering, and Vending</u>

WHEREAS, at is meeting of June 25, 2013, the Board of Trustees unanimously approved that the President or his designee be authorized to negotiate and finalize a contract with the best evaluated respondent for Food and Vending Service for the District, as deemed in the best interest of the District and subject to review and ratification of the Board of Trustees (Item 2013-6-02-10), AND

WHEREAS, American Food and Vending Service of Missouri, Inc. was evaluated as the best respondent for Food and Vending Service for the District, and a contract with American Food and Vending Service of Missouri, Inc. was deemed in the best interest of the District, NOW THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED, at the recommendation of the President, that the Board of Trustees of Collin County Community College District ratifies the action taken by the President or his designee in negotiating and finalizing the contract with American Food and Vending Service of Missouri, Inc. for a Food and Vending Service Management Program beginning July 21, 2013, and continuing for a six (6) year period through July 20, 2019.

Vice President/CFO Ralph Hall presented information regarding the bids that were received for food and vending services for the District. He said the best evaluated vendor was American Food and Vending Service of Missouri, Inc. Under the terms of the contract, Collin will receive the following:

Revenues: Five percent (5%) Food Service Commissions

Twenty percent (20 %) Vending Service Commissions

With guaranteed minimum food and vending sales of \$100,000.00 annually and the first two years annual guarantee (\$200,000.00) paid to Collin within thirty (30) days of commencement of operations. Collin will receive the greater of either the annual guarantee or the commission percentages earned annually.

Mr. Hall said that for investment and pre-operating expenses, American Food and Vending will make an initial investment of seventy-five thousand (\$75,000.00) for the purpose of improving and marketing the food service and an initial investment of one hundred and fifty thousand (\$150,000.00) towards the vending operation.

On motion of Ms. Wurzman, seconded by Dr. Collins, the Board of Trustees of Collin County Community College District unanimously approved the ratification of the action taken by the President and his designee in negotiating and finalizing the contract with American Food and Vending Service of Missouri, Inc. for a food and vending management program beginning July 21, 2013, and continuing for a six (6) year period through July 20, 2019.

2013-7-4 Approval to Monitor and Secure Pricing from Retail Electric Providers

BE IT RESOLVED, at the recommendation of the President, that the Board of Trustees of Collin County Community College District authorizes the President, or his designee, to monitor pricing offered by certain Retail Electric Providers and execute an electricity supply contract deemed in the best interest of the District.

Brian Walker, from Energy Edge Consulting, answered questions regarding the monitoring of pricing and executing of a contract for electric supply deemed in the best interest of the District. Vice President/CFO Ralph Hall said a Request for Proposal (RFP) for a Retail Electric Provider (REP) was sent to REPs certified by the Texas Public Utility Commission requesting the submission of their proposals to provide electric supply to the District. The RFP was opened on June 21, 2013, at 1 p.m. A total of nine (9) responses were received. Based on the evaluation of all proposals, the seven (7) top-scoring Retail Electric Providers

have been selected to negotiate contracts with the District and submit competitive pricing. They are Constellation New Energy, Direct Energy, GDF Suez, Gexa Energy, Green Mountain, The Texas General Land Office and Reliant Energy. The District's electricity consultant will monitor market conditions and periodically ask those Retail Electricity Providers to provide the most competitive pricing available at the time. Upon a recommendation from the District's electricity consultant, the District will select a winning bidder and execute an electricity supply agreement. Due to the nature of the electricity market, pricing must be locked in with the REP on the date that the desired pricing is obtained. The accepted price and contract will then be brought to the Board of Trustees for ratification on the first available meeting date after the electricity supply contract is executed.

On motion of Dr. Collins, seconded by Ms. Arias, the Board of Trustees of Collin County Community College District unanimously approved authorizing the President or his designee to monitor pricing offered by certain Retail Electric Providers and execute an electricity supply contract deemed in the best interest of the District.

INFORMATION REPORTS

Ralph Hall, Vice President of Administrative Services and Chief Financial Officer, reported the following:

Budget Status Report as of 06/30/13

Revenues for the month ending 06/30/13 totaled \$6,625,916 and expenditures \$10,351,025. Expenditures exceeded revenues by \$3,725,109. Year-to-date revenues exceeded expenditures by \$17,488,617. Mr. Hall said the figures were tracking as they should this time of year.

Investment Schedule as of 06/30/13

Investments totaled \$234,802,511 for the month ending 06/30/13. Investments in TexPool yielded .06% and TexStar .06%. Benchmark of the 3-month U.S. Treasury Bill was .04% on June 1 and .04% at June 30, 2013.

PRESIDENT'S AND BOARD ANNOUNCEMENTS

President Israel announced the following:

- 1. Collin has received the Gold Leadership Circle Award for Transparency from the Texas Comptroller's Office. The award spotlights local government agencies that are opening their books to the public; providing clear, consistent pictures of spending; and sharing information in a user-friendly format that lets taxpayers easily drill down for more information. Collin and Dallas County Community College District are the only two colleges/universities in Texas to receive the award. Collin's name has been added to the Comptroller's Texas Transparency website. We appreciate Ralph Hall and his staff for putting together all of the materials that led to this award.
- 2. On July 15, the Collin College Respiratory Care Program received the Distinguished Registered Respiratory Therapist Credentialing Success Award from the Commission on Accreditation for Respiratory Care at the American Association for Respiratory Care's Summer Forum in Orlando, Florida. Program Director Celi Solis accepted the award on behalf of Collin. Only 37 of the 440 accredited programs in the nation received this honor. UT Medical Branch-Galveston, a four-year program, was the only other Texas program in addition to Collin to receive the honor. The award is based on stringent multiple credentialing criteria over a three-year reporting period. Congratulations to Senior Vice President Colleen Smith, Vice President/Provost Sherry Schumann, Dean Abe Johnson, Director Solis, and the students, faculty and staff involved in the respiratory care program.
- 3. Congratulations to Chef Michele Brown who was formally inducted into the Epicurean World Master Chef Society, an organization of professional chefs focused on education, competition, and charity while promoting the culinary industry around the world. Chef Brown also recently won the title of *TCA Pastry Chef of the Year 2013*, for both the city and state at the Texas Culinary Association's convention in Fort Worth.
- 4. Alpha Delta Rho, Collin's chapter of Kappa Delta Pi, the international honor society in education, has won a 2013 Chapter Program Award for its "College Wide" Book Drive in the community service category. The award will be presented at Kappa Delta Pi's 49th Biennial Convocation in October. Congratulations to Vice President/Provost Mary McRae,

Dean Gary Hodge and special thanks to the members of Alpha Delta Rho and its advisors Elaine Zweig, Barbara Batista, and Sharon Hirschy.

- 5. Professor of Philosophy Carl Hasler published a review of "Donoso Cortes: Reading in Political Theory" in the July/August 2013 issue of *Saint Austin Review*. Professor Hasler points out the contribution of this work to a dialectical discussion of nineteenth century political theory.
- 6. Since fall 2012, all of Professor Kim Nyman's Speech 1311 students (a total of 14 classes through summer 2013) have participated in service learning via completion of the Veterans History Project. At the end of the summer II 2013 semester, 349 students will have participated, totaling over 6,500 individual service learning hours. About 90 veterans will have had their stories recorded in the Library of Congress, more than 20 of them veterans of World War II. Quotes from these veteran's stories are now appearing in the Frisco Heritage Museum's Display "Wars in the Pacific," a contribution for which the college was recognized during the dedication of the exhibit. - 7. Collin's chapter of Psi Beta, the national honor society in psychology for community and junior colleges, has been named the recipient of the 2012-2013 Chapter Excellence Award. This award is given for meeting or exceeding chapter excellence standards that reflect Psi Beta's mission. In addition, the chapter has been named winner of the Ann G. Robinson College Life Award. The judges were very impressed with the chapter's "Building Bonds" Psychology Conference and said Collin's chapter continues to be a "gold standard" for Psi Beta chapters. Congratulations to Vice President/Provost Mary McRae and Dean Gary Hodge. Special thanks to the members of Psi Beta and chapter advisors Josh Arduengo, Jennifer O'Loughlin-Brooks and Tracy Meyer.
