1. Collin College receives fourth gold-level veterans award

- The Texas Veterans Commission has honored Collin College with gold-level status for the fourth year in a row under its Veterans Education Excellence Recognition Award (VEERA) program.
 The college has received the award every year since 2021.
- The Texas Veterans Commission's practice of awarding gold-, silver-, and bronze-level statuses signifies the depth and breadth of the services provided.





2. Collin College student named 2024 Coca-Cola Leaders of Promise Scholar



- Yassin Mudawi, a Plano Campus student, was awarded the Coca-Cola Leaders of Promise Scholar \$1,000 scholarship.
- The Leaders of Promise Scholarship, sponsored by the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation, recognizes 210 Phi Theta Kappa members helping them defray educational expenses.
- Phi Theta Kappa is an honor society recognizing the **academic achievement** of students at associate degree-granting colleges.


4. New memorial honoring Sept. 11 first responders unveiled at the Public Safety Training Center



- Collin College held an intimate ceremony at the Public Safety Training Center to unveil a memorial honoring fallen first responders and others who died in the Sept. 11, 2001, attack on the World Trade Center.
- The 6-foot-tall memorial includes a 16-x-16-inch
 piece of steel recovered from the site of the attack,
 a representation of the pre-2001 New York City
 skyline, and a plaque with an inscription marking
 the display's sentiment.
- The display is available for **public viewing** in the lobby of the Public Safety Training Center during regular business hours.

5. Collin College Theatre Department presents 'Moon Over Buffalo'

- Join the Collin College Theatre Department for "Moon Over Buffalo," from Oct. 16-20 at the Plano Campus John Anthony Theatre. Tickets are free for students and Collin employees, \$5 for veterans, members of the military, and those ages 65 or older, and \$10 per person for all others.
- The production tells the story of once-popular actors George and Charlotte Hay who are stuck doing dinner theatre in Buffalo, New York. After George hears of an opportunity to star in a new picture, it takes some work to convince Charlotte that the possibility of a film career is real. Filled with mistaken identities, accidental inebriation, a meddling mother-in-law, and several romantic entanglements gone wrong, this production offers a peek behind the stage curtain.
