

## APA REFERENCE LIST

Documents used in the preparation of the following are: *Concise Rules of APA Style*, 6<sup>th</sup> ed. (2009) AND *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association*, 6<sup>th</sup> ed. (2012), as well as The Purdue OWL website (<http://owl.english.purdue.edu>).

A list of references is placed as an essay's final page or page(s). Writers should center the word References (no italics) at the top of the page, 1" from the top margin. All lines are double-spaced.

Here are some other basics:

- Maintain the running head (for a definition, see <http://blog.apastyle.org/apastyle/running-heads/>) . A shortened form of the title of a paper appears in uppercase letters at the top left of each page of a manuscript. This header helps to identify the page numbers. When a paper is published, this short title will appear at the top of each odd-numbered page.
- To learn how to format page one differently from the other pages of your essay with *Running head* and then the shortened title, see <http://www.apastyle.org/learn/faqs/running-head.aspx> .
- Alphabetize sources by the author's last name, or, if no author, by the title of the work.
- Place the first line of each entry against the left 1" margin.
- Indent the second (and subsequent) lines one-half inch, (called a "hanging indent").
- Double space between but not within entries. Do not place an extra line between each entry.
- Use only initials followed by a period for authors' first names. ( Barrie, J.M.)
- Use a comma to separate authors' names in a multiple-author citation.
- Use an ampersand (&) before the last author's name when there are one to seven authors.
- Use the DOI (Digital Object Identifier) if a DOI and URL are both present. Each DOI is a unique number assigned to the article.
- Only give the complete URL for online sources if a DOI is not available.
- Omit the period at the end of all online citations.
- Emails, non-archived discussion groups, letters, memos, personal interviews, telephone conversations, lectures, course materials handed out in class, or provided via a system such as Blackboard, are considered *personal communications* in APA. Providing recoverable data for this type of communication can be difficult; therefore, **these types of communications are not included in the Reference list. Cite personal communications within the body of a paper only.**
